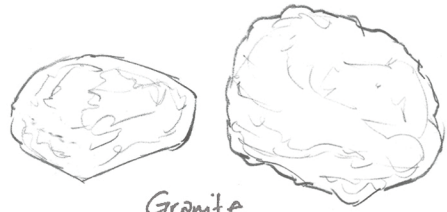


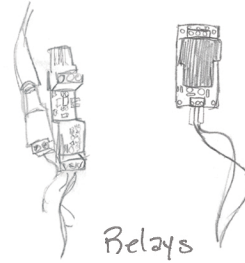
La Sierra is 83,368 +/- privately owned acres originally part of a communal land grant in Southern Colorado. For 40 years its heirs have fought for their rights to the land.

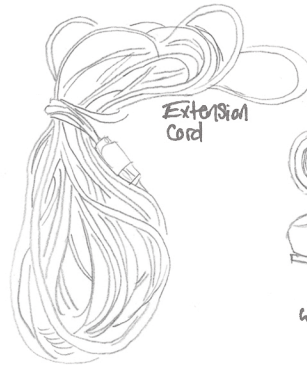
The current owner, William Bruce Harrison, has since resisted the ruling's mandate to restore access to the grant holders.

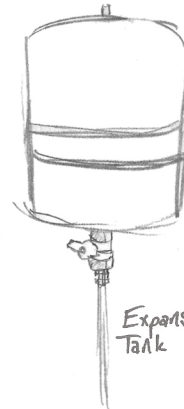

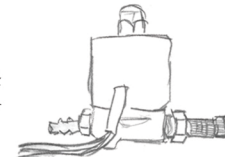
